

Agreement General Regulations: Diploma Programme



The International Baccalaureate Programme places strong emphasis on academic rigour, commitment, international understanding and responsible citizenship. The general regulations set by the International Baccalaureate Organisation state: "The IBO expects students to participate in the IB curriculum as structured and required by the school; to comply with all subject-specific regulations and internal school deadlines, and to complete the Diploma Programme over a period of two years."

Students failing to meet internal school deadlines risk not being able to achieve an IB Diploma. The school endeavours to ease the workload of the student by phasing deadlines over the two years of the IB programme. The student is given a calendar for the year to enable him/her to plan their work schedule and always know when a deadline is approaching.

The school is responsible to the IBO to give sufficient teaching time to each subject. If a student has more than 15% absence in a particular subject the school will not allow the student to sit the examination in this subject. Any student not handing in the internal assessment assigned to a particular subject on the due date, will also be disqualified from taking the examination in that subject (exception: serious illness).

Parents/Guardians must read and acknowledge the document "General Regulations: Diploma Programme".

We ask both parents/guardians and students to take note of the fact that it may happen that an Abitur exam and an IB exam fall on the same date. In agreement with the IBO, in the case of a clash the national exam (the Abitur) can be sit in the morning, whereas the IB exam can be rescheduled to the afternoon of the same day or to the next day.
